Our summer program, Camp Confidence, blends our innovative Immersion Model© classroom with the spirit of a traditional summer camp, creating an engaging, supportive, and enriching experience for our students. Each week features a new theme that drives both academics and enrichment activities. Mornings focus on small-group academic instruction aligned with students' IEP or Learning Plan goals, while afternoons are filled with experiential enrichments.

As the reading specialist, you will plan and teach 1:1 and/or small group reading lessons based upon individual students' IEP or Learning Plan goals. In addition, you will maintain documentation of student progress and communicate with the classroom team and families.

- Maintain documentation of skills taught and student progress
- Collaborate with classroom teams on student goals and progress
- Parent communication
- End of summer documentation of topics addressed and student progress made
