History of the Wolf School

The Wolf School, a small independent day school in East Providence, Rhode Island, was founded in 1999 to provide a unique educational environment for children with multiple learning differences in grades K-8. The goal was to create a school that would provide children with opportunity to reach their full academic and social potential. The founding members of the Board, including educators, clinical specialists, and a family, created a model that emphasizes the development of core grade level skills taught through a therapeutically guided curriculum. As a result, our students make significant gains academically and socially.

- Knowledge of classroom positive behavior management

- Support students to implement lesson plans related to the curriculum
- Provide support to classroom team by managing small groups under direction of team members (if a team member is absent, act in their place if necessary)
- Support classroom positive behavior protocols and/or academic plans for classroom and/or individual students (carry out classroom management system)
- Lunch/recess/snack coverage as needed
- Other duties as assigned
